I take pride in introducing myself as Satish Sharma, an Indian national bearing passport number Z-7038273 who has planned to pursue further studies abroad. I am extremely eager to begin my further studies in Australia based on my admission to the reputed University of Western Australia in my chosen degree program Bachelor of Psychology. Through this Letter of Explanation, I aim to reveal my plans for the future, my reasons for pursuing further education in Australia, choosing the University of Western Australia, and my incentives to return home after the completion of my study program. I take pride in offering the minutest detail about my profile and solidifying my candidacy as a genuine temporary entrant.

Personal and academic background

·8516 – I should maintain sufficient financial capacity for the duration of the visa.

·8533 – I must inform my education provider of my address within 7 days after reaching Australia and also my updated address if I change my address in Australia.
